# **Instructions on accepting**

# Local Loot

Business owners and managers - be sure your employees know how to accept Chamber Local Loot gift certificates.

- 1. Check the expiration date before accepting any gift certificate. Local Loot checks are good for ONE YEAR from the date of issue listed on the check. Any expired checks accepted by a business will not be redeemed.
- 2. Local Loot should be deposited into your daily deposit, just like a regular check. You will receive 100 percent of the face value of the check.
- 3. We suggest that change NOT be given unless at least 80 percent of the value of the check will be used during the transaction. Local Loot gift certificates should not be redeemed for cash.

# **Utilizing A Student Load Repayment Program for Debt Challenged Employees**

Increasingly, individuals comprising today's workforce are saddled with significant levels of student loan debt. At the same time, these workers are often conflicted as to whether they should focus on paying off their debt or set aside funds to pay for retirement. As an employer, adding a student loan repayment program to your employee benefit portfolio not only helps them address this dilemma, but also represents a tremendous opportunity to help attract and retain key talent.

To further benefit employers, the Corona virus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act (CARES ACT), passed in March of 2020, added a little-known provision regarding student loans. The provision allows an employer to make up to \$5250 in student loan payments for an employee within a year. Regardless of whether the payments go directly

to the employee or to the student loan servicing entity, the money is considered tax-free to the employee and the employer is excluded from paying payroll taxes on the funds. As of this writing, the provision, originally set to expire at the end of 2020 has been extended through December, 2025.

By structuring the program as a part of your voluntary benefits package, you have the ability to customize the program according to your workplace demographics and budgetary capabilities.

Employers can utilize a variety of methods, including fixed contributions, matching contributions, consolidating loans or refinancing the loan. With these programs, the employer first decides how much, if any, they are willing to contribute into the program.

By creating a differentiated, unique benefit package that addresses a specific employee need, employers benefit by boosting employee engagement, increasing productivity levels, and improving employee retention rates.

# Somerset County Tourism Grant Applications Open

The 2022 cycle of the Somerset County Tourism Grant program opened applications to Somerset County tourism businesses on Sept. 1, 2021.

To help guide tourism-based business owners and their representatives through the grant writing process, GO Laurel Highlands,

the county's destination marketing organization, has created a helpful grant writing video. The video is available online at www. qolaurelhiqhlands.com/grants.

Tourism grant applications will be available online at www.golaurelhighlands.com/grants on Sept. 1, and completed applications will be due by 4:30 p.m., Fri., Oct. 1, 2021. Applications will be accepted for marketing grants. To be considered for funding, applications must be submitted online. Printed applications will not be accepted. Both non-

profit and for-profit organizations are required to have a 25% cash match or a 12.5% cash match and 12.5% in-kind match.

Grants will be awarded in early December 2021 and must be spent between Jan. 1 and Dec. 31, 2022.

The annual Somerset County
Tourism Grant Program is funded by
revenues generated by the Somerset
County Lodging tax. Awards are
granted annually on the basis of merit

as determined by the Somerset County Tourism Grant Review Committee and administered by the Somerset County Commissioners and GO Laurel Highlands, the county's official destination marketing organization. Since the program's inception, more than \$5.5 million has been awarded in tourism grants.
