More than 100 dealers from three states will converge on the streets of Uptown Somerset for the 49th Annual Somerset Antique and Vintage Fair on August 10th.

This popular show, held 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. on the second Saturday of August each year, annually draws an estimated 5,000 visitors to the region and offers something for everyone, from furniture, toys and sports memorabilia to jewelry, glassware, books and more.

In addition to the antiques on display, the event includes an Antique & Classic Car Show from noon to 2 p.m. in the Somerset Trust Co. parking lot on West Main Street. A variety of food vendors will also be available at various locations during the show.

Recruitment is underway for the 2019-2020 class of Leadership Somerset County,

Teachers in the workplace

As parents, don't we all want our children to be successful and lead wonderful, fulfilling lives and hopefully provide us the opportunity to be grandparents? A large part of that success story is for them to find a career that pays

well and one that will be here long into the future. There is a misnomer that those careers/professions are only available everywhere but in Somerset County. It was assumed that our children had to leave here and raise their families far from their homeplace and that visiting your grandchildren was now, at least, an overnight trip, instead of a walk across the yard or a short drive. Fortunately, that just isn't true, as there are a multitude of careers and skilled jobs right here in Somerset County and they will be here long into the future.

Jobs are readily available in the skilled trades, such as, welding, machining, distribution, healthcare, transportation, hospitality, finance, mining, and the list continues to grow. Many of these careers only require 1-2 years of education and training and some even can be achieved by on the job training. For those students going on for 4 years or more degrees, those careers are also here in Somerset County. The county is facing a crisis, as Baby Boomers are exiting the workplace faster then those coming into it and our local businesses are all experiencing increased production and sales.

The Chamber has been actively engaged with many of our partners in helping our students learn more about the careers available in the county through many unique and innovative programs throughout the school year. The most recent program is Teacher in the Workplace.

The Chamber and our partners were recently awarded a PA grant to place 25 local teachers in the workplace to get a comprehensive look at the jobs available in the county and the training and education required in those careers. These teachers are giving up their time in the summer to learn more about the careers in the county, so they can better prepare and help our students find rewarding and family sustaining careers here; in Somerset County. Right now, we have teachers from 9 of our 11 school districts participating, so it is a countywide initiative. Our local business community has been equally responsive and have offered their help and assistance for this program. It is a total team effort.

Let's continue our efforts to keep Somerset County a great place to live, work, play and do business (and visit our grandchildren, often).

Maple Syrup Production

Jewelry: The Somerset Hospital Auxiliary held a Masquerade Jewelry and Accessories Sale to benefit the Auxiliary's pledge of \$210,000 to provide six new ventilators and two new anesthesia machines to the hospital.

Trade programs endorsed: The Somerset County Technology Center has been endorsed by the Somerset County Builders Association and received state-wide endorsement by the Pennsylvania Builders Association for its carpentry, masonry, and electrical programs.

New manager: West Central Equipment – John Deere has appointed Jim Moon, outside agricultural sales representative as the new manager of the Somerset location.

Donations: The Somerset Fraternal Order of Eagles donated \$5,000 to the Somerset Little League; \$3,000 to the Acosta Volunteer Fire Department; \$3,000 to the Somerset Historical and Genealogical Society; \$3,000 to the Garrett Volunteer Fire Department; \$2,500 to the Somerset County Honor Guard; \$1,600 to Ducks Unlimited; \$1,000 to the Cindy Barron Nursing Scholarship Fund; \$1,000 to the Somerset County Area Agency on Aging, \$1,000 to Gone to the Dogs (a group that raises, trains, and places service dogs with people who have disabilities); \$1,000 to Camp Cadet of Somerset County; and \$1,000 to the Somerset Area Ministries SAM Van program (provides free transportation to medical appointments, visit loved ones in a hospital, or to anyone who needs transportation).

Paint the Plow

Paint the Plow is a community outreach program in which students are invited to paint a PennDOT snow plow blade with original artwork to represent their individual school. In addition to being visible when in full service during the winter-weather months, the blades will be used within the school's community to enhance public awareness, promote safety, and foster greater appreciation of both PennDOT and the school's art program.

The program is open to high schools and career technical schools in each of PennDOT District 9's six counties: Bedford, Blair, Cambria, Fulton, Huntingdon, and Somerset.

Once the plow blades are delivered to the schools, they will paint the plows with a winter safety theme. The 2019 theme is "Don't Rush in Ice and Slush." Entries will be

judged through a voting process wherein a panel of judges will vote on the plows in each county. There also will be a "Fan Favorite" determined through a Facebook campaign that is open to the general public.

When the contest is over, the blades will be mounted to a plow truck in the areas of the respective school districts.
